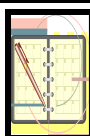
School Yard Supervision

Our Lady of the Annunciation staff have been assigned school yard and driveway supervision duties. Please help the staff in ensuring a safe and protected environment for all children. **Please allow your child (ren) to proceed to the back of the school yard alone.** This provides the student with confidence and independence. In addition, this allows staff on yard duty to more readily spot any strangers. Morning supervision begins at 8:45 a.m. so please do not have students arrive at school before this time. Please note that all staff and supply staff on duty will be wearing **orange sashes** so that students can easily identify the supervisor on duty. Also this will assist us in quickly spotting any strangers on our playground. These steps are all taken for the **safety** of the OLA students.



OLA Student Agenda

The students from Grades 1 to Grade 3 will continue to use the agenda books designed specifically for YCDSB students. This planner will assist students to develop organizational skills, track homework and provide another method of ongoing communication between the home and school. Many students require explicit instruction and on-going support in order to make the use of the agenda a successful routine. The consistent use of the Student Agenda Book provides an excellent planning and learning tool for success. The cost of this year's agenda is **\$6.00 per student**. Students in Grades 4-8 will use Google Classroom to track homework and assignments. Teachers will introduce parents to Google Classroom and provide parents with username and password on Curriculum Night. All other learning materials will be provided to cover the overall expectations of the curriculum. Individual classroom/subject teachers may send home a note informing you of voluntary enhancements available for students to purchase.



OSR (Ontario Student Record)

The OSR is the ongoing confidential record of a student's educational progress through schools in Ontario. The collection of this information is authorized by the Education Act. An OSR is established for each student in an elementary or secondary school that is operated by a public or separate school board in Ontario. A student's OSR is filed in the office of the student's school. If a student transfers to another school in Ontario, his or her OSR folder and all its contents are transferred to the new school. Should a parent/guardian wish to review their child's OSR they can make an appointment with the principal.

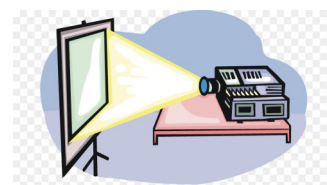
Please be advised that Monday, September 23, 2019 is a PA Day. There will be no school for students as staff will participate in faith related activities.

Canada's Anti-Spam Legislation (CASL)

Canada's Anti-Spam Legislation (CASL) impact how schools, staff and school councils communicate electronically to parents. CASL prohibits the sending of any type of electronic message that is commercial in nature (e.g., registration fees, pizza days, field trips, fundraising, etc.) unless the recipient has provided specific and informed consent. CASL does not apply to electronic information messages or to hard copy formats. To subscribe or unsubscribe to commercial electronic messages, parents should visit the school website, and using the link provided, submit a valid email address.

Visitors to the School

Parent/guardian volunteers and visitors are welcome to our school. In the interests of safety and to prevent interruptions to classes, all visitors, including parents/guardians, must report to the office first when entering the school. To ensure the safety of all occupants in the building, it is important that the students and staff know that you are an approved visitor. **If you are dropping something off for your child or a teacher, you are asked to leave it at the office.** Delivered lunches are to be dropped off at the table provided outside the office for students to pick up at 12:00. **Students ARE NOT permitted to come out to the driveway to pick up their lunch.** These procedures contribute to the security of the school and are conducive to a safe and academic atmosphere. (Policy 611)

Student Independence

If you walk or drive your children to school, please direct them to the proper play area where a teacher will be on supervision. **No adults, except supervisors (identified by sashes), are allowed in the playground behind the school or in the kindergarten yard.** This helps to develop independence and also supports our policy regarding visitors to the school. Parents picking up children at the end of the day are asked to meet them at an agreed upon meeting spot. This will help facilitate an orderly and safe dismissal.

The Protection of Anaphylactic Students

The York Catholic District School Board has a comprehensive policy to help protect students with life threatening allergies. Protecting anaphylactic students from exposure to life threatening substances creates a major challenge to all elementary schools.

As outlined in the policy, parents are asked to inform the school of such allergies immediately and are required to fill in **S15** and **S15a** forms which are available in the office. Each form must have a passport size picture attached so that the student is easily identifiable to staff. Parents are also asked to ensure that students for whom Epi-Pens are prescribed, have two Epi-Pens at school. Twin-jet Epi-Pens are not acceptable for school use. **One Epi-Pen must be worn by the student in a fanny pack at all times, which includes on the bus, on excursions, and on all other school related activities/sports. The other Epi-Pen must be stored in the school office for emergency use only. This Epi-Pen will also be taken on trips.**

The following are avoidance strategies we will be implementing at Our Lady of the Annunciation to help keep all our students safe.

- ◆ *We will continue with our "nut safe" school environment via food restrictions. Students will be informed of and reminded that they are not to share food. The school environment includes entire school grounds, buses and other modes of transportation, school trips, before/after school/weekend programs, and school sanctioned events involving pupils.*
- ◆ *We will prohibit food outdoors to minimize exposure to insects (i.e. wasps, etc.).*
- ◆ *We will continue to communicate regularly to the entire school community that we are a "nut safe" school via newsletters, and posting of "nut safe" signs throughout the school.*
- ◆ *We will take special precautions around holidays and special celebrations, by planning activities that ensure the health and safety of our students. No cakes, cupcakes, muffins, donuts, and the like, will be allowed in the school for birthday recognition purposes. If parents are wishing to send in a "treat", non-edible treats (stickers, pencils, etc.) are encouraged.*
- ◆ *We will continue to ensure that all products sold through the school for fundraising or other wise are nut safe, as well as being in keeping with the Food and Beverage Policy.*

We will continue to ensure that permit holders, visitors and all school staff are aware of these precautions.

Administration of Medication

If your child requires prescription drugs, please check with your doctor about the possibility of prescribing medication that could be taken before school and/or after your child returns home. If your child is required, in the opinion of the child's physician, to take medication at school, it is the Board's policy that parents/guardians submit a completed Administration of Medication form (S-16) to the school with the medication. Do not send medication to school with your child without notifying the school and completing the form. Medication must be kept locked in the office, in its original container with your child's name clearly marked on it. (Policy 207)

Lunch Routine

A lunch routine form is to be completed for the school by parent/guardian, one form for each child. Students remaining for lunch eat in their classrooms and prepare for recess for the first twenty minutes of the lunch period (12:00-12:20). During the lunch hour, (12:00-1:00 p.m.) these students are to remain on school property. For safety reasons we ask that students **NOT** bring in parent notes requesting us to let students visit local stores or restaurants at lunch time. If your child's lunch time routine changes, a note signed by parent/guardian will be required at that time and for EACH such occasion and sent to your child's teacher. Students will not be permitted to use the phone to change lunch arrangements, please plan ahead at home.

Students are expected to arrive at school with their lunch and snacks in the morning. However, at times you may need to deliver a lunch to school. Please keep this to a minimum, for emergency or special occasions. **Parents dropping lunches off are asked to please inform your child ahead of time to pick up their lunch from the lunch table outside the office.** Please label lunches with your child's name and teacher's name.



Bussed Students

The front driveway is reserved for buses until approximately 3:40 p.m. Bussed students are dismissed through their grade doors of the school at 3:30 p.m. to safely board the busses. Staff supervise students until all busses leave the school.

Locked Door Policy

The school doors are kept locked at all times. Visitors must use the "buzzer" and identify themselves. Child Care parents are to use the child care entrance. This is for the safety of all.

Walkers and Students Who are Driven

Walkers and students picked up by car are dismissed through their grade **doors** at 3:30 p.m. Please establish a meeting place with your children.

Parents /Caregivers Who Pick Up By Car

A very important reminder- the parking lot will be open for the Kiss and Ride program every morning from 8:45a.m. to 9:00 a.m.

You can help make the Kiss and Ride program even more successful by following these simple steps:

- Never leave your car parked or unattended
- Your child(ren) should have their backpack on their lap to enable them to exit the vehicle quickly
- Have your children exit on the sidewalk side of your car



Transportation-Busing

Transportation is provided for students who reside within the transportation zone established by the Board. Busing is a service provided by the Board. As with any service, there are expectations upon which its use is conditional. Students must adhere to proper bus conduct and follow guidelines established by the driver and school to ensure the safety of all. Riding the bus is a privilege. Students must take the bus they are assigned to each day, switching buses is NOT permitted for safety reasons. Non bus students are NOT permitted to ride the bus, make any necessary arrangements at home, ahead of time for after school activities. Please be aware that any changes to transportation schedules cannot be made through the school. 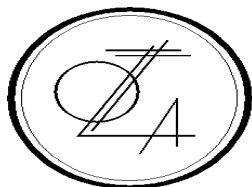
Electronic Devices

Cell phones/IPODS etc., no electronic devices are permitted to be used at school during school time, that is from 8:45 a.m. to 3:30 p.m. unless they are being used under the supervision of teachers for the purpose of curriculum. If students choose to bring these devices to school and they are stolen or lost, the school is not responsible. Students should never take photos at school with their phones, except for special events, with the teacher's knowledge and permission. If these devices are used during school time and are visible, the items will be kept at the office until a parent is notified.



Safe and Responsible Use of Technology

The YCDSB strives to provide its students and staff members with current technology to access curriculum resources, enhance communication and gather information. At OLA, we are fortunate to have computers and internet access in our classrooms and in the library. Use of the Internet provides staff and students the tool to access information globally. Students need to understand how technology can be a wonderful tool, when used safely, so that they gain the knowledge and technological skills that they will need in the future. **All parents/guardians must sign an "Information Technology Student Acceptable Use Agreement" form prior to allowing students access to the Internet.** Please discuss the form that will be sent home on the first day of school with your child, sign it to indicate your support for student use of technology at OLA, and return it to your child's teacher. (Policy 220)

The Our Lady of the Annunciation website is updated regularly. The website design is easy to navigate and features the school's prominent information such as our contact information, SAFE ARRIVAL—Student Absence Reporting, bullying reporting feature, calendar, transportation, and school forms on the home page. Communication with Teachers

When a parent wishes to speak with or arrange a meeting with a teacher, please contact the school to leave a message for the teacher. The teacher will contact you as soon as possible to make an appointment and/or address your concern.



Emergency Procedures Forms

Your child's emergency form will be sent home later this week for you to verify that the information is correct and accurate. Please make any changes if needed and/or sign and return it to your child's teacher.

Lost Items and Valuables

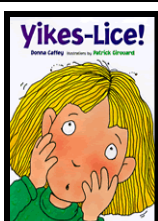
No matter how vigilant we are, clothing and possessions do go missing. Check the Lost & Found area! To avoid confusion, please take a moment to **label your child's clothing**. Valuables, which include costly toys, jewelry and all electronic devices **must not** be brought to school due to the potential for loss, damage, or theft.

Volunteers

Vulnerable Sector Screening: It is our Board's practice that all volunteers hold a valid Vulnerable Sector Screening (Police Check). The purpose of this is, of course, to ensure the safety of students, staff and community members. There are some exceptions to this requirement that may be considered: the volunteer is always in the presence of school staff, the volunteer is never alone with students and is not in a position of trust or responsibility. The volunteer is directed not to use student washrooms or change rooms. Situations in which we will require volunteers to get a VSS are: Volunteers driving students on trips, to sport events, etc, volunteers on school trips that require them to be alone with a small group of children, or situations that require the volunteer to be completely alone with a student. We truly value the assistance of all of our volunteers and we hope that you will continue to work with us and support our efforts to ensure the safety of all our children. Ensuring a strong home school partnership are the keys to success for our children. If you are interested in volunteering in a classroom or supporting pizza lunches and milk program, please speak to your child's teacher. Your support would be greatly appreciated.



HELP PREVENT HEAD LICE!

Each year, cases of pediculosis (head lice) are found throughout our schools. In an effort to reduce the numbers of cases found and decrease the inconvenience to parents/guardians and students, we request your assistance. As your child is now returning to school after a long holiday, please inspect his/her hair and scalp for pediculosis. Periodic inspections during the year will help prevent the spread of head lice. Head lice are tiny (1/8" or 3mm long) wingless insects with flattened bodies. They cling to the hair by means of six legs. They live mostly behind the ears and at the nape of the neck. The female lays tiny, yellowish-white eggs called nits. They resemble dandruff but are attached to the hair by a cement-like material and are very difficult to remove. It is usually the eggs that are noticed first. If head lice are found, do not return your child to school until treated. This will prevent the spread of pediculosis. Children are only allowed to re-enter the class when all the nits are removed from the hair. Engaging Our Communities

Drop Off and Pick Up

Our first and foremost commitment is to provide a safe environment for almost 300 students and we ask that all drivers —whether dropping students off or simply commuting to work—drive with particular care in and around the school.

Given the traffic congestion challenges associated with having students dropped off or picked up in our Kiss and Ride each day, we would once again encourage you to walk your child to and from school whenever possible. Parents and guardians who drive their children to school are asked to please abide by the following:

- approach the school patiently, with consideration for pedestrian traffic, other drivers, and the staff on duty
- our Kiss and Ride loop is in front of the school; drive cautiously all the way to the end of the driveway close to the field area, drop your child off and proceed around the loop back onto Bayswater Avenue.
- when dropping off a child (or children), drivers are asked to pull into the furthest available curbside spot and take care when merging back into the inner driving lane; no student should be dropped off from the inner driving lane and subsequently walk between vehicles
- at no time should a vehicle be left unattended or otherwise parked in the Kiss and Ride
- If you wish to walk your child to the gate, please park in a parking spot. Do not block the bus loading zone.
- kindergarten students should be dropped off at the gate by the kindergarten enclosure
- For students who take the bus to school, please ensure that your child is at the bus stop in advance of the time given to you on the school bus website. Be patient, as the buses are sometimes delayed by traffic. More information about bus routes and times can be found at www.schoolbuscity.com. Parents and guardians, it is important to remember your child's bus number and pick-up and drop-off time

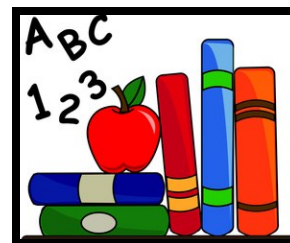
Terra Cotta Cookies and Ice Dawg Sales
